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#### Basic presentation skills important to virtual




- 1. Content is king

#### Thoughts on slide usage.....



Don't pack too much information into a slide
• "Presentation" vs "Documentation"

- Number of slides is not the problem





### Your audience will develop an impression of you within the first 15 seconds



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Don't waste that time squandering what may be your greatest opportunity to captivate them



#### What Makes a Great Presentation Opening?




- Show some energy! You're on stage (virtually)!
- ➤ Be unique and memorable first 15 seconds
- Describe the benefits
- Tell a story
- Exciting, interesting graphics
- Start with the big picture
- Memorize your opening
- The audience wants to like you!



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#### Change things up! Audience engagement





Find ways to include interactive elements.

- Encourage audience to use chat window
- Ask the audience a <u>specific</u> question
- "think about this for a moment..."
- Ask the audience to write down a list
- Tell a story
- Change voices by using a guest speaker
- Polls and videos

#### The prepared closing



FINISH

- ➤ If you take questions at the end, be prepared with a strong closing following the last question
- Memorize your closing
- What you hope your audience does with the information they have received or the skills they have acquired
- A call to action to get active in something

#### Specific new skills important to virtual




- 1. Cameras and body language
